### Practical Halacha - The Three Weeks

#### Haircutting and Shaving.

Ashkenazi custom is not to take a haircut from 17th Tammuz until midday on the tenth day of Av. Sefardi custom is not to take haircuts during the week of Tisha b'Av.

**R. Soloveitchik:** the period of the three weeks mirrors the period of 12 months of mourning after the death of a parent. Since our practice is to shave regularly, one may do the same during the three weeks.

There are a number of exceptions:

- 1. Mustache:** If a mustache is growing in a way that it inhibits eating, one may trim it.
- 2. Women of marriageable age.** **Rav Shlomo Zalman** allowed a woman of marriageable age to take a haircut during the three weeks and even during the nine days.
- 3. Trimming eyebrows.** Rav Moshe Feinstein one cannot trim eyebrows during shloshim, and therefore may not do so during the three weeks. **Rav Shlomo Zalman it is permissible to trim eyebrows (and eyelashes) during the three weeks.** He felt that such hair removal is not considered to fall into the halachic category of "haircutting".
- 4. Taking a haircut for the purposes of a mitzva.** It is permissible to take a haircut for the purposes of a mitzva. If hair has grown so as to cause a chatzitza for his tefillin, he may take a haircut to allow him to properly fulfill the mitzvah.

**Rav Shlomo Zalman** only permitted one to cut the hair in the area that the tefillin will rest on his head. It could be argued kavod ha'briyos would permit one to cut during the three weeks, specifically in an instance where it would look ridiculous to cut part of his hair and not all of it.

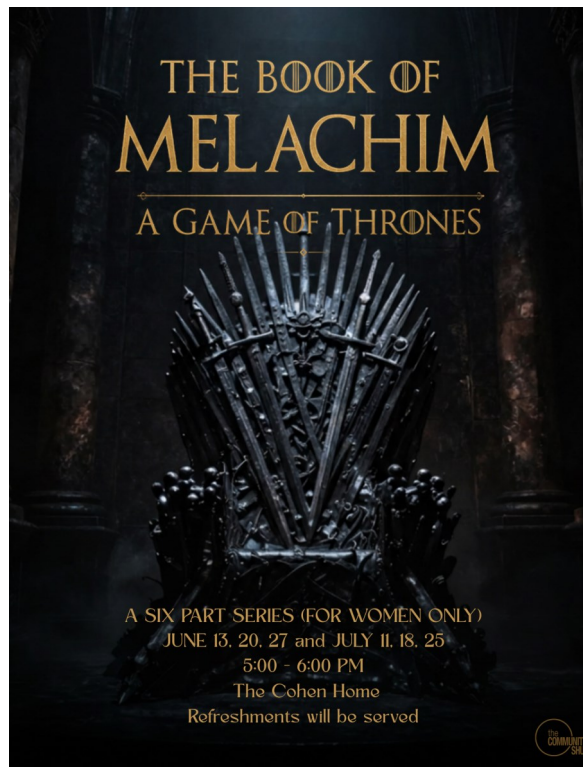
