PRACTICAL HALACHA

Shehecheyanu

The two days of Rosh Hashanah are regarded by many as one extended day and one extended period of holiness. Therefore with regard to the blessing of Shehecheyanu the authorities disagree whether one should say the blessing of Shehecheyanu on the second night during kiddush, and for women who have the custom of reciting the blessing of Shehecheyanu upon lighting the candles, the same question will arise. In fact the same problem presents itself for the bal tokeya on the second day if the first day is not Shabbos. In deference to this opinion, the custom is to place a new fruit on the table so that the blessing of Shehecheyanu during kiddush is also over the new fruit. Some have the minhag to make the blessing of ha'etz over the fruit and eat less than a kezayis immediately after kiddush and before eating challah. Others (more popularly) eat the fruit after washing and making the blessing over the challah.
