PRACTICAL HALACHA

Erev Yom Kippur

It is a Torah mitzva to eat on the 9th Tishrei. You should have in mind that you are fulfilling a Torah mitzva. The meal is eaten before the fast.

There is no minimum amount that has to be given for kaporos.

Women may light and then drive to shul if they do not accept Yom Kippur until later. If they do this they should NOT make shehecheyanu when lighting candles, but say it in shul at Kol Nidrei. Women who made shehecheyanu when they lit should NOT say it in Shul.

Havdala must be made on a candle that was lit throughout Yom Kippur. The candle lit for yizkor should not be used for havdala, unless you have nothing else. If the candle went out before havdala then you must use a flame lit from before Yom Kippur in order to make havdala. One wick is sufficient for havdala.

Every married man is supposed to light a special candle that is supposed to be lit over the entire Yom Kippur.

Women are allowed to wear gold on Yom Kippur. However it is better not to wear special jewelry.

A talis must be worn before sunset in order to make a bracha. A bracha may still be made until nine minutes after sunset.

No part of the body may be washed for pleasure even with cold water. If any part of the body gets dirty, it can be washed. In the morning, hands should be washed until where the knuckle meets the palm of the hand.

Vidui is a mitzva from the Torah. You must know the translation of the words. Vidui must be said while standing and without leaning on anything. Vidui must be said while bowing. It is similar to the bowing when saying Modim. If this is difficult then at least bow the head.
